# WEEKLY MEDITATION — Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The ability to hear and speak are two great gifts, but like all gifts, they can be taken for granted or misused. In today's Gospel we see the trouble Jesus went to on behalf of a deaf and mute man. Jesus touched his ears and his tongue. More importantly, he touched his heart. This miracle of touching the heart has great relevance for us precisely because we likely already have the gift of hearing and speech.

A fate even worse than being born

deaf is to have good ears and yet fail to hear. Worse again is to have ears and *refuse* to hear, or to have a tongue and refuse to speak. We need the Lord's healing touch if we are to use these two precious gifts well.

The miracle is not so much about the physical healing of a man who was deaf and dumb, rather it's about the opening of a person's ears so that he was able to hear the word of God, and loosening of his tongue so he was able to profess faith in Jesus. A person could have perfect hearing and yet not hear the word of God. A person could have perfect speech and be unable to pray an act of faith.

We need to truly hear the word of God. Then we need to be able to profess that word with our lips. Finally, we need to put it into practice in our lives. The word of God, when heard and acted upon, is like seed falling on good soil. It makes our lives fruitful.

# From Pope Benedict's lips to our ears:

The Vatican recently issued a question-and-answer format book that teaches the truth about Jesus & the Catholic Church.

# **Question:** To whom is given the task of <u>authentically</u> interpreting the Sacred Deposit of Faith (Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition)?

Answer: The task of giving an authentic interpretation of the deposit of faith has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church alone, that is, to the successor of Peter, the Bishop of Rome, and to the bishops in communion with him. To this "Magisterium," which in the service of the Word of God enjoys the certain charism of truth, belongs also the task of defining dogmas which are formulations of the truths contained in divine Revelation. This authority of the Magisterium also extends to those truths necessarily connected with Revelation.

# **Precious Gifts**

The gift of hearing is a precious gift, but it is only with the heart that we can hear *rightly*.

The cry of a needy person may reach our ears, but unless it reaches our heart, we will not *feel* the person's pain, and it is unlikely that we will respond.

The gift of speech is also a precious gift, but again it is only with the heart that we can speak *rightly*.

For our words to ring *true*, they must come from the heart.
If they come only from the lips, they will be a *hollow* sound and will have little effect.
They will be like a wind that ruffles the surface of the water, but leaves the depths untouched.
