WEEKLY MEDITATION for the 22ND Sunday in Ordinary Time



As soon as Jesus entered the home of the P h a r i s e e who invited him to dinner, he

knew that he was being watched with hostile eyes. The Pharisees had already made up their minds about him. They wanted evidence they could use to get rid of him. Many people are inquisitive about the faults of others but negligent to correct their own. In fact, nothing so blinds us to our own faults as a preoccupation with the faults of others. So it was that Jesus was able to turn the tables on the Pharisees. He had been observing them and saw things he didn't like, so he told them of their selfish and self-serving actions, and questioned their motives.

Jesus suggested to his host that if he wanted to do something really gen-

erous, he should invite the kind of people who would never be able to invite him to their houses. True giving occurs when nothing is expected in return.

There are obvious lesson for us in all of this. With what kind of eyes do we observe others? We would be better employed by looked at our own faults rather than those of others.

What is the quality of our good deeds? Giving is at the heart of the Gospel, but it has to be selfless.

Places of Honor

Once the mayor of a town invited all the people of the town



to a banquet. Among those who showed up was a man of great distinction by the name of Daniel. Daniel was a great scholar and a wise man, yet he was very humble and didn't like being honored. When he arrived, the mayor natu-

rally invited him to sit at the head table. Daniel thanked him but said he would prefer to sit among the poor at the table nearest the door. And that he did.

When other distinguished guests arrived, the mayor invited them to sit wherever they liked. Naturally, they choose to sit at the head table. The banquet hall filled up and eventually the only place left was one at the back table. The mayor had no option but to take him to the vacant seat.

"But this is the least important place," the man protested.

"No, this is the head table," the mayor replied. "I don't understand," the man said.

Wherever Daniel, our guest of honor, sits is the most important place.

It's not the place that honors the guest, but the guest that honors the place. The person with true humility never has to be shown his place; he is always in it.

"Sincere humility attracts. Lack of humility subtracts. Artificial humility detracts."

This summer we will offer 30 ways to

live a holier life. Holiness is for everyone who wants to be *more effective* at spreading the Light of Christ to loved ones. Holiness isn't just for monks and nuns; it's for everyone.

#26: Share your gifts. If you sew, crochet, or knit, then donate homemade items to children in hospitals or the elderly in nursing homes. If you love to read, then record books for the blind. Cook or bake homemade goodies with a single working neighbor or a busy young family. If you're handy — offer to help a neighbor with minor fix-it jobs.

#27: Look for evidence of God's love every day. And then share what you see with someone.

#28: Dress modestly. Avoid outfits that are designed to call attention to yourself inappropriately. For example, don't accent body parts with clothing, piercings, tattoos, jewelry, etc. That kind of attention is quite likely to distract people from noticing the practice of your faith.

#29: Don't give up. Serious problems like drug abuse, gambling, alcohol addiction, or money trouble can drag anyone toward giving up trying to improve your situation. No matter what your struggle, remember that no matter how many times you fail, God will never leave you. God loves everyone of us individually, even the worst sinner in the world. But God hates the sin that can eat us alive like a cancer. Never give up trying to bring God's goodness into a difficult part of your life. Keep trying. Many of the great saints were big sinners at first.

#30: Fear not. It's human to fear trouble, illness, pain, or even death. But God's children know that He will always provide what we need (for example, the spiritual strength to get through a difficult challenge). In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus said (Luke 12:32): "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom." And Our Lord also said (Matt 6:33): "... seek first the kingdom [of God] and His righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides."
