### WEEKLY MEDITATION

### 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus' parable in today's Gospel tells a tale of two sons asked by their dad to go work in the family vineyard. The first one asked says he will go, but doesn't. The second son refuses to go, but regrets saying "No" and goes to work. Which, Jesus asks, did what his father wanted?

All of us believers are prey to the inconsistent behavior of the first son. We may be convinced that we have

not refused the Lord in any way. We can always say the right thing because we are used to using words and ideas that find their inspiration in God's word. Thus we readily fall into fooling ourselves about whether we indeed working in the family vineyard, working to bring God's kingdom more fully into this world. We can be so clever in our way of speaking and arguing, so sure of

where we are and what we are. We can be so determined not to change, using all of our energy and zeal to change others. Jesus indeed invites us to help others change for the better — when we do that we bring about evangelization and conversion. The lesson of this parable is that in our certainty about our message, we do not neglect to do the hard work of living the message.

### **Words and Regrettable Actions**

A father and his young sons were out for a ride with the horse and buggy (many years ago). It had been a very rainy week, and the roads were extremely muddy. They turned onto a road that had one set of deep ruts in the middle of it which they began to follow. As they came closer to the middle of the mile stretch of road, they saw another horse and buggy coming toward them in the same set of deep ruts. Both buggies stopped horse to horse.

The father quietly told the other man that he would have to back up. The man argued that the father and the sons could back up just as easily as he could. They began to argue about it and finally the father looked at the other in the face and said, "If you do not back up, I'm afraid I am going to do something I'm going to regret."

The man looked at the father and began backing his horse and buggy down the road. The father and his sons remained still, giving the man the opportunity to get out of their way. The younger son, who had been raised in the Catholic tradition that the use of violence was not right, was astonished, and he asked: "Dad, what were you going to do that you were going to regret?"

His father answered: "I was going to back up."

One lesson that MIGHT be drawn from this story is that slick words that sound like threats of violence can get us far in life and still be OK because we didn't "really" mean it. Of course our Catholic tradition also teaches that misleading others by seeming threats of violence is not right.
