WEEKLY MEDITATION — Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

We judge a person by the heart. We describe sorrow and joy in terms of the heart. "Her heart was broken." "His heart overflowed with joy." We also describe burdens and wounds in terms of the heart—a 'heavy heart' and a 'broken heart'.

Today's Gospel gives two telling examples of the primacy of the heart. The first concerns worship. The most damning thing that can be said about someone's worship is that his heart is not in it. One of the best things that can be said is that it comes from the heart.

A corrupt heart is the worst form of badness. It means to be bad at the core. A pure heart is the best form of goodness. It means to be good at the core.

The Gospel places great emphasis on the heart. The heart is the source of all of our thoughts, words, and deeds. The Pharisees paid more attention to the outside than the inside. They were more preoccupied with having clean hands than having clean hearts.

Jesus said that the source of evil is within us. It has its roots in the heart. All of the sinful things that he lists have their start inside a person. Their seeds are within us all, so we must constantly struggle against them and deal with our sinfulness by striving for cleanness of heart. It's the heart that matters, and only God can see what is in the heart.

From Pope Benedict's lips to our ears:

The Vatican recently issued a question-and-answer format book that teaches the truth about Jesus & the Catholic Church.

Question: To whom is the Sacred Deposit of Faith (Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition) entrusted?

Answer: The Apostles entrusted the deposit of faith to the whole Church. Thanks to its supernatural sense of faith, the people of God as a whole, assisted by the Holy Spirit and guided by the Magisterium of the Church, never ceases to welcome, to penetrate more deeply and to live more fully from the gift of divine revelation.

Some points to consider regarding a Baptism

The parents need to be parishioners. Sometimes for reasons of family tradition, a baptism here is desired; then it is essential for parents to bring a letter showing they are parishioners elsewhere.

Godparents need to be practicing (and confirmed) Catholics. If they are not our parishioners, they need to bring a Baptismal Sponsor Certificate from the parish where they do belong.

The reason for these requirements is the child's spiritual welfare.

The Sacrament of Baptism is no light matter. It is a serious event with a serious promise that the parents and Godparents will make it their duty to give the Catholic Faith to their child in the raising of that child. We grow in Faith by teaching the Faith in word and deed.
