WEEKLY MEDITATION

Strive to enter through the narrow door. (Luke 12:24) How often do you hear that phrase and feel something in you rising to the challenge, or how often do you feel convinced that you will never measure up? How often does the narrow gate seem just too narrow, giving you the sense that unless your life is what it should be the doors will close on you? Neither of these responses is exactly what Jesus had in mind. The "striving" He wants from us is the effort to remain rooted in faith and trust, not in doubt or despair. Jesus' arms are always open wide. He is always beckoning us to come to Him and receive His grace. He knows that we will never be at peace as long as we believe salvation is something we have to earn. We will either be busy working too hard, or we will be preoccupied by our weaknesses, wondering what we have to do just to squeak by. At Mass Jesus invites us to come to the feast not because our lives are perfect, but because we have freely embraced His gift of mercy. All He asks is that we hold on to our confidence that He will never abandon us. God loves us immeasurably. This can be so hard to believe when our natural reaction is to prove our worth. Yet, Jesus stands by us saying, "It's not your hard work, but your heart that I desire." Lay your heart before Him and the narrow door will open wide for you.
