WEEKLY MEDITATION

The Place No One Prefers Jesus wasn't against anything nearly as much as he was against hypocrisy—the kind of behavior whose only motive is to be noticed and admired by others. In today's Gospel Jesus offers us the parable of the banquet guests. We all know how we worry about where we will sit or wait tensely to see where the host will seat us at a special event. Yet, not only as guests, but all of our lives we seek a place for ourselves, social status, and approval of others. We are bothered if others do not notice our worth. Jesus asks that His disciples not spend their lives in competition with one another, but rather that they peaceably take their places, the ones that no one else prefers to occupy. Those places are precisely the most difficult and require the most responsibility. Jesus doesn't want us to take places that are not meant for us. He asks that we occupy a place of humility.

Giving without Receiving The other thing that Jesus demands from His followers is that they do not perform acts of goodness and mercy based on the business principle of "give and get" for those who can reciprocate, but that they do good and show mercy to those who cannot return the favor. If we examine our lives, we might be surprised by how much we have done out of unreciprocated love, just as Jesus did the most good for those who could not repay Him—the helpless, the poor, the sinners, the least among us.
