WEEKLY MEDITATION

Shortly after Mary received the good news, actually very scary news, from the angel that she was to bear a son, she gave that gift of presence to Elizabeth, her cousin. She set out

on a long and dangerous journey to visit her cousin whose pregnancy was already far along. Mary could have, through a messenger, sent greetings conveying her wishes about the coming birth of John the Baptist. Rather, she went in person and gave to Elizabeth something no messenger could possibly give. She gave the grace of her presence.

When the Holy Father came to this country a few years ago people traveled hundreds of miles just to be in his presence. They could have seen him more clearly on TV but his physical presence was like electricity. His presence exerted a compelling force upon them. As we approach the day when Jesus became present to us, I suggest that we ask ourselves: Is there someone in my family or among my acquaintances who is lonely, who is sick, who is estranged from me or possibly alienated from everyone, for whom my presence might make a difference? If so, pay that visit, give that gift, offer the grace of your presence. Even if it is turned down you have still offered the gift, and He who came to be present among us will know it.



Dear Parishioners. As we retell the Bethlehem story each year, its familiarity can obscure one of its most important lessons. We do not celebrate at Christmas some immutable dogma, but a particular

moment. Christians believe that this particular moment, when Luke tells us that a child was born in a manger, punctuated in a decisive way the march of human history. The Christmas story speaks to both the fragility and the resilience of human life, manifested in the miracle of birth and the possibilities of people. The story of the journey of Mary and Joseph to Bethlehem, taken in a particular place and in a particular moment of time, reminds us each year that our personal lives and the communal lives of nations are also journeys, moving always into an uncertain future, remembering the past and renewing its wisdom, never allowed or condemned simply to repeat the past, but a journey made in faith that is confident that the final word of the story will be one of light shining in darkness. Let us keep the spirit and message of Christmas alive in this more liberal, secular, and often times anti-Christmas world.

SHARE HAPPINESS WITH OTHERS

December...the month of darkness, coldness, loneliness...the month when we draw near to the end of something—the end of the year. People usually don't like to face the end of something. It often makes them apprehensive and uneasy. For those who have no one, or have recently lost a loved one, or who are barely surviving, this time of year is "salt on the wound". Those who take refuge in depression withdraw into themselves and wait for everything to end. All of this reminds them even more intensely that they are alone or poor.

Television, movies, richly decorated cities, store displays, elegantly dressed people in the company of family and friends, and abundantly laid tables represent a world to which they do not belong. If a person is alone, he is still alone even in a crowd. The throngs of people around him mean nothing because he is still alone with his thoughts, which no one hears. He has no one with whom to share them. For those for whom this is not the case, it is easy enough to preach contrived optimism and convince them that all is not as bleak as it seems, and that things will get better.

Therefore, try to share at least a little of your happiness and good fortune with others, but don't do it as an obligation to earn merit in heaven. Do it from the heart. Invite your friends from work and your neighbors to a holiday meal. Set aside a some money for some small gifts or Christmas cards. Let those who are less fortunate than you feel that they have a connection to someone, at least during this holy season, and that someone cares about them. You will see that the real meaning of the season is in giving and not just in waiting to receive. The gift that gladdens your heart leaves an impression on you and the ones to whom you offer your good will and kindness.
