WEEKLY MEDITATION - St. Valentine



Believe it or not, though this day is all about love, what is perhaps the most common legend of St. Valentine has its roots in warfare! Around 270 **Ine'S** B.C., the Roman Emperor Claudius II forbade men to marry because he thought it made them bad soldiers - less interested in defending the empire and more interested in their families. The Roman Em-

pire at that time was large, and its borders on all sides were constantly challenged, so Claudius II needed every man he could get to serve in the army in order to maintain control over Roman territory. A priest named Valentine is reported to have continued performing marriages in secret, defying Claudius II, for which Valentine is said to have been imprisoned and executed.

Another legend says that while Valentine was in prison awaiting his execution, he fell in love. (This was before the time priests could not get married.) He sent the object of his affection, a young woman thought to be the daughter of the man in charge of the prison, a love letter signed "Your Valentine." The first valentine was therefore sent by the man himself! In 498 A.D. Pope Gelasius declared February 14 the feast day for St. Valentine. So how did February 14 become the holiday of red hearts, roses, and poetry? As St. Valentine's popularity grew, so did the story of his love letter. It became customary to give a loved one a token of affection in memory of Valentine. As printing technology developed, those tokens of affection went from hand written notes to printed cards, and thus the tradition unfolded further into the Valentine's Day we know and celebrate today.

WISDOM'S CORNER "The BUTTERFLY"

A man found a cocoon of a butterfly. One day a small opening appeared. He sat and watched the butterfly for several hours as it struggled to force its body through that little hole. Then it seemed to stop making any progress. It appeared as if it had gotten as far as it could, and could go no further. So the man decided to help the butterfly. He took a pair of scissors and snipped off the remaining bit of the cocoon. The butterfly then emerged easily, but it had a swollen body and small, shriveled wings. The man continued to watch the butterfly because he expected that, at any moment, the wings would enlarge and expand to be able to support the body, which would contract in time. Neither happened! In fact, the butterfly spent the rest of its life crawling around with a swollen body and shriveled wings. It was never able to fly. What the man, in his kindness and haste, did not understand was that the restricting cocoon and the struggle required for the butterfly to get through the tiny opening were God's way of forcing fluid from the body of the butterfly into its wings so that it would be ready for flight once it achieved its freedom from the cocoon. Sometimes struggles are exactly what we need in our lives. If God allowed us to go through our lives without any obstacles, it would cripple us. We would not be as strong as what we could have been. We could never fly!

REMINDERS We ask your cooperation in abiding by the following reminders of appropriate behavior during Holy Mass:

- -Please maintain a respectful silence in church.
- -As a sign of respect and honor of the Blessed Sacrament, please genuflect before entering and upon leaving your pew. Those who cannot genuflect should bow their heads.
- -Please respond to the prayers during the mass clearly and loudly.
- -During the Creed, bow your head at the words proclaiming the incarnation.
- -When receiving Holy Communion, please bow your head and respond by saying "amen".
- -Please do not stand in the rear of the church or sit in the pew assigned to the ushers.
- -Gum, candy, etc., should not be chewed, or eaten in church.
- -Please turn off all cell phones before you enter the church.
- -Please do not leave the church before the priest leaves the altar.
