WIDOM'S CORNER Is it a saint?

A very earnest young man visited a famous rabbi. He told the rabbi that he wanted to become a rabbi and asked for advice. It was winter time. The rabbi stood at the window looking out into the yard while the young man gave him a glowing account of his piety and penances. The young man said, "You see, Rabbi, I always dress in spotless white like the sages of old. I never drink any alcoholic beverages; only water ever passes my lips. I perform numerous penances. For instance, I always carry sharp-edged nails inside my shoes to mortify me. Even in the coldest weather I lie naked in the snow to punish my flesh., and I take a dozen lashes every day on my bare back." As the young man spoke, a stable boy led a white horse into the yard and took him to the water trough. The horse drank his fill of water and then rolled in the snow as horses sometimes do. "Just look," cried the rabbi. "That animal, too, is dressed in white, drinks nothing but water, has nails in its shoes, and rolls naked in the snow. It also surely gets its daily ration of lashes from its master, but I ask you, is it a saint, or is it a horse?"

Penance is not an end in itself. The whole object of penance is to reform a sinful way of life!

A Matter of Life

Did you ever prepare for a special dinner by eating a light lunch or skipping it altogether? The idea was to make room for

your favorite foods. That's the basic idea behind fasting during Lent. The penance we do during this season helps us create more room in our lives for God. Giving something up for Lent doesn't have to be about food. You can "fast" from anything that you treasure but don't really need. Fasting creates an inner hunger that can take you in one of two directions. It can eliminate the desire for the thing you have given up, thus making more room for God, or it can create a stronger desire for what you gave up. So, when you finally return to it, you appreciate it all the more. Either of these options can bring you closer to God. The important thing is that choosing to fast during Lent will help you celebrate the richness of Easter in a more complete way.

Christ's suffering and crucifixion. The concert will take place on Monday, March 14, at 7 p.m. Please mark this special event on your calendar. Back by popular demand, the Bridgeport Choral Society, now in its 11th season of sing-

ing sacred choral music in the Chicago area, will once again present five performances of the the St. Matthew Passion by German composer Heinrich Schütz (1585-1672). "Schütz is one of the most influential yet little known composers of early sacred music," said director Frank J. Glab. "He was one of the first composers to utilize solo voices combined with choral polyphony in the dramatic telling of a story. This oratorio style combining soloists with a four-part choir is a form that modern listeners are accustomed to," said Glab, "as it is the basis for such well-known works as Handel's Messiah and Bach's St. Matthew Passion. The fact is that Schütz brought this form to Germany after studying with Gabrieli and Monteverdi in Italy."
