WEEKLY MEDITATION — Third Sunday of Lent

One theme runs through all of today's readings: we are loved in our sins. In spite of our ingratitude, complaints, and sinfulness, God provides for His people. He gave Moses the power to provide water for the Israelites in the desert. St. Paul tells us that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. In the Gospel we hear that Jesus approached the woman at the well with great respect, not judgment or condemnation. Right from the start He was looking into her heart, yet He did not make her feel bad, rather she felt accepted and understood. He showed her that up to now she had been looking for the right thing—love—but in the wrong places. The He told her that He could give her the "water" that would quench her thirst for love and meaning in life.

Where was this water to come from? Surprisingly it was to come from inside herself. The spring was already there. It was just that up to now it had been hidden and blocked off by sin. Christ meets us where we are. He makes us aware of our own emptiness and then shows us how to fill this emptiness, not from without, but from within. He says to us what He said to that woman at the well: "If you only knew the gift God wants to give you." We often find it difficult to admit our weaknesses and sins, but until we do we cannot receive the grace God wishes to give us, which is the life of God inside us. It doesn't do us much good to be loved for being perfect. We need to be accepted and loved precisely as sinners. Being loved like that gives one surprising courage and energy. It puts us in touch with our true, God-given nature, a place where we can drink and refresh ourselves in the water of eternal life.
