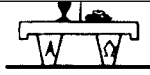

WISDOM'S CORNER *What is within you?*

When he found him he returned the stone and said, "I have been thinking. I know how valuable this stone is, but I give it back to you in the hope that you can give me something much more precious. If you can, give me what you have within you that enabled you to give me the stone."

A Matter of Life

Love and sacrifice cannot be separated. All love, whether it is that of warm friendship, respectful love for parents, the consuming love of husband and wife, or the devout, reciprocal, complete love between God and men — all love pre-supposes sacrifice.
