WEEKLY MEDITATION — 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew compares the arrival of Jesus on the scene to the coming of a great light to a people who had been living in deep darkness. In order to appreciate a light, one must be conscious of one's darkness and desire to escape from it. Each of us has areas of darkness in our lives—fear, illness, pain, sin, guilt, loneliness, and so on. Society too has its dark areas. Hence our need of the light of Christ. Though the light comes as a friend, it also disturbs us because it shows up what is wrong. There are still many people who live in darkness. We need the light of Jesus now more than ever. The light of Jesus did not come to judge us, but to save us, to show us how to live, to show us the way to the Father's Kingdom.
