WEEKLY MEDITATION—Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's readings we are dealing with a unique and specific "call", or what is more commonly referred to as a vocation. Samuel is being called to the role of prophet, and Andrew and the others to discipleship. The initiative is always with God. The "call" is always God's. Every call demands a response.

God calls us, too, in many ways and at many different levels. He called

us into life. Throughout our lives God continues to call us to a life worthy of our dignity as his children. At death God will call us from this life into eternal life. God's call can take many forms and be fulfilled in different ways. It is not likely to be as dramatic as the call of Samuel, yet God speaks to us in the depths of our hearts, calling us to intimacy with himself and to be coworkers in the world. Rather than a

voice, his call is more a tug at our hearts, which we feel at quiet and reflective moments in our lives. Just as Samuel was called by God to the task of being a prophet, so each of us is called to do some specific work for God in the world. The call of the disciples applies to us too, because at our baptism we were called to discipleship. Every vocation is a call to the fullness of love!
