#### WEEKLY MEDITATION for the Feast of the Epiphany

The journey of the Three Kings, or Magi, was neither simple nor easy. They encountered difficulties, doubts and dangers. Yet they persevered in their quest and were rewarded when they finally found Christ. Like them, we too are on a journey along which we encounter troubles. We must imitate the Magi by asking for guidance and having faith that the difficulties,

doubts, and dangers will pass and we will once again see the "star" of our faith in Christ beckoning to us.

The Magi can serve as models for us on our faith journey. They were single-minded, refusing to be put off by hardships. When they found Christ they offered him their best treasures. This shows what happens to those who find Christ. Their hearts are

awakened. When we find Christ and offer our love to him, he will help us to open the treasures of goodness that lie within us so that we can share these gifts with others. Having met Christ and heard his Gospel, we will have different attitudes, values and goals. It is impossible to encounter him and not discover our own "riches" that we can offer to him as gifts.

**THE CELEBRATION OF EPIPHANY,** also known as the **Feast of the Three Kings**, means that Christmastime is drawing to a close.

These Three Kings are Biblical characters (they are called "Magi" in the Gospel of Matthew's Chapter 2), but alas the Bible did not specify their names. Using its earliest oral sources, however, the Catholic Church has by tradition called them **Gaspar**, **Melchior and Balthasar**. The Bible *does* record their gifts for the Christ Child in Bethlehem: **gold** (an appropriate gift for Jesus in his role as Christ the King), **frankincense** (this pure kind of incense is an appropriate gift for Jesus in his role as the Eternal High Priest), and **myrrh** (this incense used at funerals is an appropriate gift for the baby Jesus because of the importance of his death and resurrection).

This is also the start of a new year, and by tradition the Church has its annual house blessings in the time around Epiphany. Newly blessed houses are marked with 20 + G + M + B + 06, in honor of the year, and in honor of the Three Kings. Please contact the Parish Office to arrange for the blessing of your home.

#### In Giving We Receive...

Once the people of a very poor parish set their hearts on acquiring an expensive set of figures for their Christmas crib. They worked hard to buy the precious porcelain figures and were so very proud of them. The church was left open all Christmas Day so that people could visit the new nativity scene. In the evening when the pastor went to lock the church, he discovered that baby Jesus was missing and wondered who would steal him. As he stood there he spotted a little girl with a small buggy entering the church. She headed straight for the manger. Then she took the baby Jesus out of the buggy, lovingly put him back where he belonged, and then knelt to say a prayer. As she was on her way out the priest stopped her and asked what she was doing with baby Jesus. She told him that before Christmas she had prayed to baby Jesus for a buggy for her doll and promised that if she received one, he would have the first ride in it!

It was the poverty of the child Jesus that evoked the lovely act of generosity in the little girl. The poverty of Jesus is a challenge to us too. It gives us an opportunity to open our hearts and share ourselves with one another.
