WEEKLY MEDITATION



The Transfiguration was one of a handful of genuinely exhilarating moments in the mission of Jesus. His was hardly a life of wine and roses. It was one tough existence. We have a nasty habit of confining His difficult moments to His last days. That judgment comes out of enormous naiveté. Christ elected Peter, James, and John to join Him. The other nine left at the base camp must

have been delighted that they had not been drafted. They were busily looking about for a shady tree, a cool breeze, and a stream in which to bathe and do laundry. No doubt they needled the three unlucky ones with the message, "Tell us about it tomorrow, fellows." The four finally got to the top about 4 p.m. They had to be running on empty. Peter and his friends had one thought and that was sleep, but Jesus chose to pray. As the apostles climbed into their sleeping bags, they probably agreed that each person has his own idea of a good time. Then, in the early morning hours the mountaintop exploded as though it had taken a hit from an atomic weapon. The apostles were basket cases. Their Employer "was transfigured before their eyes...His clothes as radiant as light." The next day Peter, James, and John came down that mountain jumping from rock to rock with the agility of boys. They were on a high. Their Jesus was a big winner. Their trip had been eminently worthwhile. "Lord, how good it is for us to be here!"

LENTEN REGULATIONS:

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on God Friday and on all of the Friday of Lent.

FASTING is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age buy not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

On the weekdays of Lent, we strongly recommend participation in daily Mass.

Looking For A Fresh Approach To Commemorate Christ's Passion?

If you've been seeking a more meaningful, soul-searching Lenten experience, here's your opportunity. We've invited the Bridgeport Choral Society to present a dramatic sung performance of Christ's Passion in our church on Monday, **March 22**, at 7:30 p.m. Based on "The St. Matthew Passion" by Heinrich Schütz, this sung Passion will include soloists and a four-part choir.

Schütz, a 17th century German composer, is one of the most influential yet little known composers of early church music. He was one of the first composers to utilize solo voices combined with choral polyphony in the dramatic telling of a story, but because his works were originally written in German, his choral masterpieces are not well known today. To remedy that, The Bridgeport Choral Society will perform The Passion in English. All are invited to take part in this moving Lenten experience.

WISDOM'S CORNER THE CARPENTER

An elderly carpenter was ready to retire. He told his employer-contractor of his plans to leave the housebuilding business and live a more leisurely life with his wife enjoying his extended family. He would miss the paycheck, but he needed to retire. They could get by. The contractor was sorry to see his good worker go and asked if he could build just one more house as a personal favor.
