WEEKLY MEDITATION — 6th Sunday of Easter

The greatest need each of us has is for real, unconditional love, yet we often find it hard to believe that this is how God loves us. We tend to believe that God will love us only if we are good. God loves us not because we are good, but because He is good. Our very existence is a sign of God's love. God's unconditional love for us is the Good News. Our response is to try to return that love. This means listening to His word and putting it in action. Jesus said, "If you love me, keep my commandments." We don't keep His commandments so that He will love us; we keep His commandments because He loves us. This means following His way of life. Real love is shown in deeds. People know us by what we do, not by what we say. It's not easy to live as a disciple of Jesus in the modern world. It never was an easy thing, and for that reason Jesus has given us the Holy Spirit. When we are weak, we must pray to the Spirit. The spirit comforts us in times of sorrow, enlightens us in times of darkness, and makes us brave and strong in times of weakness. The apostles knew that Jesus loved them. We know that Jesus loves us, too. There is no mistaking love. You feel it in your heart. It is like a flame that warms your soul, energizes your spirit, and supplies passion to your life. Love is our connection to God and to each other. "Love one another as I have loved you." That sums it all up!

I know the Psalm, but you know the Shepherd!"

EVANGELIZATION/ASCENSION SUNDAY—May 8
