We like to stay in our comfortable rut and just go from day to day, year to year doing the same old thing in the same old way. But change happens constantly. We could no more exist in the Holy Land of two thousand years ago than we could fly, nor could those people exist in our world. Things have changed tremendously in our own lifetime.

Dear Parishioners,

I often think about our elderly and about old age. Frequently we priests visit hospitals and homes for the aged. We are witnesses to human destiny and the tragedy of abandoned elderly people, and often see the elderly regarded as surplus members of our society. They are often treated without respect and dignity. At times, those of us who are strong and healthy act as though we don't understand the elderly who are without health and strength. Why is this so when they are the ones who have given us everything? We should be considerate of the elderly, and honor them with time, attention, and understanding. We will one day be in their position when we are dependent upon the love and care of others. As Christians, we are called in a special way to give of ourselves to those who need us. If our priorities are only money, profit, and pleasure, then in what will we be able to hope when we have grown old? There are too many people among us who are lonely and need a few minutes of our time, human contact, and a smile. Let us not view life only through profit and money. If we have elderly people in our homes, if we have elderly tenants, if they are dependent upon our kindness, then we must be there for them. Perhaps it will be difficult, but the burden might just become the instrument of our salvation and personal joy. Christ said: "Of what profit is it to you if you love only those who love you?"
