WEEKLY MEDITATION

Jesus said to his disciples and says to us, 'Pray continually and never lose heart.' Some people do not see the value of regular prayer. They think it is enough to pray when and as they feel inspired to. For such as these the following story is told. There was a small town that had all the municipal institutions: a bathhouse, a cemetery, a hospital, and a law court; as well as all sorts of craftsmen: tailors, dressmakers, shoemakers, carpenters, masons and so on. One trade, however, was lacking. There was no watchmaker. Now as the years went by many of the clocks became so inaccurate that their owners just decided to let them run down, and ignored them altogether. There were others, however, who maintained that as long as the clocks ran, they should not be abandoned. So they wound their clocks day after day, even though they knew they were not accurate. One day the news spread through the town that a watchmaker had arrived, and everyone rushed to him with their clocks, but the only ones he could repair were the ones that had been kept running. The abandoned clocks had grown so full of rust that he could do nothing with them. Prayer is vital. It clarifies our hopes and our intentions. It helps us go forward and encourages us to act. It is a journey into the heart of life and fosters our relationship with God. Prayer is the anchor of our lives. It is its own reward. It enriches us and enables us to live more deeply, more fully, and more authentically. Pray always!



Dear Parishioners,

As you know, on April 20 of this year we purchased the land across the street from our school for the price of \$700,000. By the feast



of Velika Gospa we succeeded in clearing and preparing the property, which came in quite handy for use on the day of our main parish event. On Friday, September 17, the zoning committee of the City of Chicago approved the re-zoning of the parcel from residential to offsite parking. As far as city procedures are concerned, the paperwork is complete. Everyone is aware of the fact that we did not sponsor a fund raising campaign to finance the parking lot: therefore, we appeal to all of you who are able to help, and ask you to consider contributing to this project so that we can move forward with it and plan for the future of our parish community. Our monthly loan payment is \$11,900.00. We are grateful for all of your help and the sacrifices you make on behalf of our parish.
