

WEEKLY MEDITATION

Today's readings tell us about that good God, that forgiving God, who would choose to not destroy Moses' followers for adoring a golden calf. It is a God who would allow a persecutor like Paul not only to repent, but to become the one who would bring Christianity from being a small sect within Jewish circles to being a Christianity which truly welcomed all sorts of people. It is the same God who would allow Dorothy Day to move from her way of life to the way we recognize as good. If we look at the Gospel parable we find the story of a son who basically says you are dead, Father, so give me my share of the inheritance. Yes, to demand ones share while ones father was still alive was tantamount to saving that to me you are dead. It says, God may have left you alive, father, but I want you out of the way. I want to do my own thing with everything that is mine. Only when he finds himself lower than a pig does the son awaken and realize a need to come and ask forgiveness. Something in his very gut says I am wrong. I need forgiveness. I need to know I am loved, even if my status with my father cannot be regained. So, he comes home, his father loves him into new life.
