Sir Gawain agreed to marry a grotesquely ugly woman to save King Arthur's life. Keeping his commitment, he went to live with her. Knowing his reason for their marriage, her only request of him was one kiss, which he gave her, showing neither pity nor revulsion. With this kiss she turned into a beauty and told him the story of the curse that was put upon her until it could lifted by a man of character. However, he must choose between her beauty by day or by night. He answered that the choice must be hers, not his. With that response the rest of the curse was lifted and she remained beautiful day and night.

Sir Gawain's love was not concerned with his personal needs. He saw beyond them and was concerned only with the happiness and well-being of others. His desire to save his king's life and empower his wife is what healed each of them and brought them real joy.
